This is that pit we've been keeping an eye on for the past week. It took quite a bit of trimming to determine that there was not an infection underneath.

We normally don't want to "core out" pits like this, or this deep. However, the location and appearance of this particular pit was a little worrisome. Always check with me before doing something like this.

This is a good example of why daily foot checks and good communication are so important. Had we not noticed or addressed this, it could potentially have led to a problem under the nail.

Keep up those feet checks, and make sure to speak up -- and write it down -- if you think you see a problem.

Training done on a daily basis

Accomplished

Jenny has been quite agitated this month due to construction around the Large Mammal barn. This means that we have given her "days off" when we feel it would be unproductive or the session would be a failure. The staff performed blood draws three times this month, two of the times the blood draw was done in the chute. Jenny cooperated very well, however, on one occasion she left the area as soon as she was released (she normally likes to hang out near the keepers). Footwork was performed two times this month in the chute. Except on "days off", Jenny is asked daily to do one or more of the following: basics, salute, stretch, half, and/or down. Which she has sometimes been a little slow to complete, but she has always complied. During controlled bath days (again depending on her mood) the staff has been working on rectal desensitization with the water hose and manual manipulation of the area (moving the tail, touching all around the area). This is done both in the stall and in the chute.

Problem areas

The chute is still inoperable; therefore all training done in the chute is done in the "open" position. Construction all around the area has Jenny agitated and rocking. Some days it is hard for her to focus so she is given a "day off" and is given lots of enrichment.

Goals for next month

- γ Continue rectal desensitization with the hose and manual manipulation of rectal area.
- γ If new power supply is completed, resume chute desensitization.
- γ Blood draw weekly
- γ Footwork as needed


