

** Records detailing the dimensions and composition of the current outdoor and indoor elephant enclosures....*

The elephant exhibit at the Kansas City Zoo is dog-boned shape. The length is 950 feet long with the width varying from around 20 feet to over 50 feet. The substrate is dirt. There is a large concrete based pool at one end and several mud wallows within the exhibit.

The elephant barn is a concrete building with both floor and air heat. There are 6 "open stalls that each measure 29 foot by 30 foot. There are two solid stalls – one measures 19 foot by 38 foot the other is 19 foot by 28 foot. There is a restraint area within the barn. The actual restraint measures 13 foot by 6 foot. The back hallway leading to the restraint is 30 foot by 9 foot and the front hallway is 47 foot by 9 foot. The ceiling in the barn is 17 foot high. The floor is made of concrete.

**Copies of all records relates to plans – either future or underway – to expand elephant exhibits and/or acquire new elephants.*

The Kansas City is a full participant in the elephant TAG/SSP. Therefore we will acquire elephants and/or surplus elephants based on the recommendations of the TAG/SSP. These recommendations to move animals are based on genetic, breeding potential and social needs of the entire population managed by the TAG/SSP.
