Medical History:

- Has extra blood drawn monthly for CBC and chem panel
- Tested positive for West Nile in 2003. Vaccinated for tetanus in 2003-04
- Vaccinated for West Nile in 2003
- Radiographs of all feet in 2004
- Eye exam 2004
- Yearly trunk washes performed to test for TB
- Vestibulotomy performed December 2006 to remove mummified fetus from 1999 pregnancy, receiving daily treatment
- Weight assessment ~8,500 lbs.

Aggression History:

- Has shown aggression towards other cows periodically
- Not typically aggressive towards keepers

Reproductive History:

- Has had trans-rectal ultrasound performed, is reproductively sound
- Became pregnant in 1999
- Carried calf to term but was unable to give birth, was given oxytocin injections but still unable to pass the calf
- Surgery performed to remove calf after onset of labor

Relationships within the Herd:

- Officially ranked 1 of 6
- Was hosed with Megan previously
- Is dominant to all cows

Restraint History:

- Readily allows keepers to squeeze her down and put straps on

Chaining Training:

- Accepts leg chains readily
