Prob: Broken tusk

PE: Keepers noticed this morning that she had broken off her left tusk at the base. No blood was noted. On visual exam the tusk is broken and has an irregular surface. One portion is broken up above the gingival line creating a small pocket. Keepers flushed tusk with nolvasan which elephant tolerated fairly well. She continues to eat and act normally. Instructed keepers to flush area and apply SSD ointment twice daily. Since pulp cavity is exposed area will be monitored closely for sign of infection. Consider capping off tooth if it causes problems. (JJD)

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
