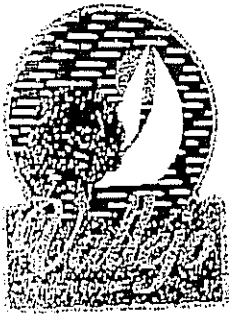

Re: Six Flags Discovery Kingdom Mammal Inventory

Dear Martin:

We have received Park Management Corp.'s ("PMC") request to the City of Vallejo that we provide representation that the mammals at Discovery Kingdom are owned by PMC and the City as shown on the Detailed Inventory Report for Mammals, dated November 28, 2006 ("Inventory"), which was prepared by PMC and provided to the City. As I understand it, PMC would like the City to agree to the ownership of the mammals as shown on this Inventory.

As you know, the Management Agreement between the Marine World Joint Powers Authority and PMC requires, among other things, that PMC care, feed and train all animals, and to further keep full, true, and accurate books and records, including animal inventory records to enable identification of ownership. These records are administered by, and under the control of, PMC. Because the City relies on PMC to maintain the mammal inventory records, the City is relying on PMC'S representation that the Inventory provided to the City is accurate.


As I understand it, PMC has made this request of the City in order for PMC to obtain an exhibitor license or permit from the U.S. Department of Agriculture for the Six Flags Discovery Kingdom park site. Therefore, in order to help PMC expedite the USDA permit process, the City will agree to allow PMC to submit the Inventory with the ownership of mammals as stated on the Inventory for this very limited USDA permit process. As the City has not had sufficient time to make an extensive review of all ownership and other records in the custody of PMC, the City reserves the right of ownership over any of the mammals listed on the Inventory should PMC not exercise its option to purchase the Discovery Kingdom amusement park. If PMC does not exercise its option, then the City will review the appropriate records and determine which mammals, and other animals it has an ownership interest in at Discovery Kingdom. The City's willingness to allow PMC to submit this Inventory to the USDA should not be construed as a waiver of any of City's rights to claim ownership of the mammals. Furthermore, should it become necessary, the City may require PMC to provide further documentation proving PMC owns, paid for, and/or otherwise acquired any or all animals in question.
